Host responsibilities

(Do not read aloud)

- Arrive 30 minutes early to take over Host from room opener.
- Check that "Mute Participants Upon Entry" is checked
- Set chat to "Hosts and co-hosts only." (Turn chat on for everyone about 5 minutes before meeting ends to allow for exchange of phone numbers, etc.)
- Please line-up a leader, timer and a co-host ahead of time.(Note: it is good practice to get an ongoing commitment for the timer and co-host slots for your term as a host.)
- Participants to read out of their own big books, pages 58-60 (*How it Works*), 562 (*Traditions*), 164 (*Vision*), and 83-84 (*Promises*), or we can put the readings up on the screen.

- Change meeting setting to NOT "allow participants to un-mute themselves" (remove check mark)
- Mute all attendees at meeting start time, and un-mute to share in order upon virtual raised hand.
- Host reads the entire format and calls on readers.
- Leader calls on participants to share; host un-mutes.
- If participant does not have video on, security should be ready to remove any potential bomber.
- Tuesday and Wednesday Noon meetings are book studies. Read only the Steps, not, "How It Works".

Our primary purpose is to Stay sober and help other alcoholics to achieve sobriety.

We ask all who participate to confine their discussion to their problem with alcohol. Please avoid cross talk or feedback and limit your share to 3 minutes.

This is an open meeting of Alcoholics Anonymous but we ask that participation be limited to members of the fellowship who have not taken any intoxicating substance for the last 24 hours.

Per our Group Conscience, there is no smoking or vaping allowed on camera at this meeting.

Is there anyone present who is in their first 89 days of sobriety? If so, please raise your virtual hand and introduce yourself by

your first name and day count only. We ask this not to embarrass you but so we may get to know you better.

At Serenity Circle we recognize certain lengths of sobriety. We encourage you to celebrate milestones that you have reached either today or this past week.

Would anyone like to take a virtual chip for 3 months, 6 months or 9 months? If so, please raise your virtual hand and tell us your name and milestone only.

Is there anyone celebrating an AA birthday either today or this past week? If so, please raise your virtual hand and tell us your name and years only.
